Guy's qualifications are impeccable he has EFA NCAS Level 2 General, NCAS Level 2 Showjumping NCAS Coach Educator qualifications as well as being an EFA Level 2 Course Designer and EFA Level 2 Showjumping Judge

Guy has competed in showjumping for over 25 years. He has represented Australia in New Zealand on two occasions and has the distinction of being the Australian Showjumping Champion four times.

Guy has spent considerable periods in Europe and was a World Cup finalist in England in 1981. The highlight of his career was competing in two Olympic Games, representing his country in Montreal Canada in 1976 and again in Los Angeles USA in 1984.

Guy also won one Pacific League World Cup Title and competed in 86 qualifiers, winning thirteen of them. Guy has ridden for his country in 12 National Cups.

Guy is an 'easy going' yet very professional person, with a friendly approachable manner and dry sense of humour. Although he is still riding, Guy has taken a great interest in training young riders and is a strong and valued supporter of the Pony Club Movement.

Mrs Diana Keach, resident in SA and mother of Scott Keach, one of Australia's past leading event riders, was also appointed as the National Pony Club Australia Coach for 2007 and 2008. She is an EFA Coach Educator and Assessor and EFA NCAS Level 2 General Coach.

Diana Keach has served the equestrian sport as an instructor and coach since 1970 and has been the chief instructor of many clubs, resulting in her being the recipient of Medal of the Order of Australia.

She has been Chief Instructor of the Goolwa District Pony Club since 1980 coaching riders to national and international levels. She has also held numerous judging positions with the Equestrian Australia.
